Approval of the minutes: Upon a motion duly made and supported the minutes of the Sixth
Division Council were accepted as published on the Division's website.

Approval of the Treasurer's Report: Upon a motion duly made and supported and carried on a
voice vote the Treasurer's Report was accepted for filing. The budget was shared it is the
same as last year. With membership down we need a fundraiser .

Division Committee Reports:
